



### Youth Art Project



A group of our youth, talented in various forms of art (mixed media, drama, film, painting, drawing, singing, dancing, and sculpture), gathered together by Zoom in April to dream up two pieces of art. The following month, two of those youth joined Pastor Laura to create the art. The acrylic painting on canvas is an image of the Israelites journeying through the parted Red Sea into the sunrise. Written in the middle is a verse from a sermon series in Exodus, "In your strength, you will guide them to your holy dwelling." The sermon series journeyed alongside the Israelites' transition of leadership from Moses to Joshua. It was preached in the weeks leading up to the change in pastoral leadership in our congregation. We put the art on display at the outdoor worship services that included Pastor Jenny's last Sunday of worship, a lay-led worship service, and then the first few Sundays of worship led by Pastor Jay. The second piece we created is a heart made from toilet paper rolls. The youth thought it would be creative to make something beautiful out of the very thing many of us were worried about at the start of this pandemic. In our visioning meeting, we discussed the sin of

selfishly hoarding driven by a fear of scarcity and the faith required to trust God's provision, even in the midst of a global pandemic. This project was funded by an art grant Pastor Laura applied for from the North Carolina United Methodist Church Annual Conference Creative Arts Committee. We hope to make another piece in the coming months with the remainder of the money!

### From The Worship Team



Your Worship Team has been busy keeping the Online Services relevant and expanding the Sunday Zoom Service to now include weekly communion! If you have not yet joined us, make it a point to visit with old friends already there on Sunday's starting at 11:00 am. There is plenty of fellowship time and lively conversation starting around 10:45 am before the service and immediately following the service.

After hearing continued inquiries about the Parking Lot Service and after careful consideration we have made the difficult decision to not re-start the Parking Lot Service at this time.

How did we arrive at our decision? We started analyzing our attendance numbers for all of the services offered to determine where our resources have the most impact. Comparing the numbers for the past parking lot services and online service logins, the Parking Lot Service attendance averaged 35 people per week while the Online Service logins averaged 81 per week. The Live Zoom Service that started in December is averaging 39 logins per week to date.

Just looking at the raw numbers one can conclude that The Parking Lot Service draws approximately the same as the Live Zoom Service but notice that the Live Zoom Service is counting logins and not actual people. If our average Live Zoom Service household has two people watching at the same time (some have four and some just one) we are averaging over 70 people each week in attendance. What this tells us is that we are reaching many more people on the Live Zoom Service than the Parking Lot Service. Furthermore, the regular faces that we see on the Live Zoom Service are the same faces we normally would see at the Parking Lot Service.

Some comments that are regularly made:

- We can be in person and talk to one another. The Worship Team feels that based on the fellowship that goes on before and after the Live Zoom Service talking to one another is very much happening on a weekly basis.
- Let's do outdoors for special things. The Worship Team has strived for, and accomplished, reliable consistency with what we are currently doing between the Online Service and Live Zoom Service. Consistency has been the ultimate goal for our congregation from the beginning of COVID. What we have firmly established with consistency will be negatively impacted by random Parking Lot Services. Furthermore, we will isolate, maybe permanently, roughly 40 people who will be affected by no Live Zoom Service and do not attend the Parking Lot Service on these inconsistent weeks. Some of our folks rely on the Live Zoom Service for socialization on Sunday.

Though neither service is ideal, the Live Zoom and Online Service are the most effective approach we can take in reaching as many as we can in our congregation on a weekly basis until such time we can gather in our building for live worship.

As COVID is still taking its toll on God's kingdom we must stay diligent in our efforts to minimize the risk of contraction and the Worship Team will continue to engage our congregation using the best means possible. Please be assured that indoor services will resume just as soon as we can safely do so. We ALL pray for that day to come!
